#### GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- After overcoming a 14-point first half deficit, OKC managed to forge an 84-84 tie on the back of a Kevin Durant slam-dunk with 1:59 left in regulation. The score would remain tied at 84 apiece until Rudy Gay connected on a 20-foot jump shot from the top of the key with 1.3 seconds remaining in the game. On the ensuing Thunder possession, Kevin Durant missed what would have been the game-winning three-point field goal just as time expired.
- Memphis forwards Rudy Gay and Zach Randolph combined to score 50 points as the Grizzlies secured their tenth consecutive home victory. On the night, the duo of Gay and Randolph converted 19 of the Grizzlies' 29 made field goals.
- With his game-high 30 points to go along with a team-high (tying) eight rebounds, Kevin Durant posted his 17<sup>th</sup> consecutive 25+ scoring effort which is the longest streak for any player in NBA history under the age of 22. In addition, KD now has 24 games of 30+ points which is the most in the NBA this season.
- OKC fell despite holding the Grizzlies to 39.2% shooting on the night, including 12-of-34 second half shooting (35.3%). The Thunder is now 7-2 this season when holding opponents to sub 40.0% field goal shooting.
- The game featured 11 lead changes and 10 ties. With the loss, OKC falls to 4-5 on the first night of a back-to-back.

#### GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- With his 11<sup>th</sup> double-double of the season, Kevin Durant led the Thunder past the Timberwolves for the team's third consecutive victory. OKC is now a season-best six games above .500. By capturing their 24<sup>th</sup> victory, OKC eclipsed their win total for all of last season. Additionally, the OKC franchise has not been six games above .500 since the end of the 2004-05 season (52-30).
- After trailing 59-63 at the 7:13 mark of the third quarter, OKC scored 15 unanswered points before taking a 77-69 advantage into the fourth quarter. OKC would lead by as many as 12 points in the second half.
- Kevin Durant gave OKC a 94-86 lead with 2:13 remaining in the fourth quarter after knocking-down a 15-foot jump shot. MIN would then score the next six points to trim the OKC lead to two points. Jonny Flynn missed what would have been the game-winning three-point jump shot for the Timberwolves just as time expired.
- Corey Brewer led Minnesota with 25 points to go along with six assists and five steals in 41 minutes of action.
- With his game-high 31 points, KD has topped the 30-point scoring mark in 13 of the last 16 Thunder contests.
- Thunder rookie James Harden came off the bench and contributed 12 points and three assists in just under 26 minutes. Harden has now recorded double-figures scoring in five straight games.

#### GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- Led by Kevin Durant's 29 points and a double-double from Jeff Green (15 points / 11 rebounds), OKC snapped ATL's four-game home winning streak as the Thunder captured their 23<sup>rd</sup> victory of the season. With their 23<sup>rd</sup> win, OKC equaled their win total for all of last season.
- With the Thunder ahead 90-88, Jeff Green's driving slam-dunk (three-point play) over Josh Smith with 12.2 seconds remaining gave OKC a five-point lead. Jamal Crawford missed a game-tying three-point field goal for the Hawks just before time expired.
- Serge Ibaka came off the Thunder bench to pull-down 10 rebounds to go along with six points (3-6 FG's) in 24 minutes of action. Ibaka has now recorded 10+ rebounds in back-to-back games for the first time in his career.
- The Thunder led by as many as 15 points at the 7:29 mark of the third quarter after two made free throws by Jeff Green. OKC is now 7-1 on the road this season when leading after three quarters of play.
- On the night, OKC held ATL to 40.0% shooting (36-90 FG's). The Thunder is 8-1 this season when holding their opposition to 40.0% shooting or less.

## OKLAHOMA CITY THUNDER NOTES

**KD is Streaking:** With his game-high 30 points last night versus the Grizzlies, Kevin Durant extended his FRANCHISE RECORD by scoring 25-plus points in 17 straight games (12/22 @ LAL – current). Additionally, Durant becomes the first player in NBA history under the age of 22 to piece-together 17 straight games of 25+ points. Ray Allen held the previous franchise mark by recording 25-plus in ten straight games during the 2006-07 season. It has been nearly two years since another NBA player matched KD's 25+ scoring stretch. LeBron James recorded 21 straight games of 25 or more points scored during the 2007-08 season (1/25/08 – 3/8/08).

**Belated Gift:** Since Christmas day, Kevin Durant LEADS THE NBA IN SCORING with a 32.0 point-per-game average on 53.0% field goal shooting including 40.0% (24-49) three-point shooting.

**30 Never Looked so Good:** With his 30 points versus Memphis (1/22), Durant recorded his 24<sup>th</sup> 30-plus scoring game of the season. The 24 games of 30+ points is the MOST in the NBA this year. Most importantly, the Thunder is 15-9 when Durant scores 30+. KD is one of only two NBA players (LeBron James) to piece together two five-game stretches of 30+ points this season. Earlier this year, Durant set an all-time franchise record by scoring 30+ points in SEVEN consecutive contests (12/22 – 1/2). During this two-week long run, Durant posted averages of 33.6 points on 56.8% shooting (84-148 FG's) including 45.8% shooting from behind the 3-point arc (11-24). LeBron James was the last NBA player to piece together a seven-game string of 30+ points scored (November 2007).

**Feasting on the East:** By defeating the Atlanta Hawks 94-91 on January 18<sup>th</sup>, OKC improves to 15-4 (.789) versus Eastern Conference opponents. The 15 wins against "The East" are the most by any Western Conference team in the NBA this season. With a record of 13-2 vs. "The East", only the Los Angeles Lakers have a better winning percentage (.866) against Eastern Conference opponents. This year, OKC has already "swept" three Eastern Conference teams (Miami, Detroit and Washington). Last season, the Thunder failed to "sweep" a single Eastern Conference foe as OKC concluded the year with an 8-22 mark against "The East".

**Road Warriors:** During the first two months of the season, the Thunder won three consecutive roads games on two separate occasions (11/11 - 11/17 and 12/23 - 12/29). As a point of reference, the OKC franchise failed to win three straight road contests in each of the last two seasons. Despite their loss to the Grizzlies at the FEDEX Forum (1/22), OKC still owns a 12-10 record away from the Ford Center. OKC has already surpassed their road win total for all of last season (8-33). The Thunder is one of SEVEN NBA teams to boast a winning road record this season.

**Boards are the Barometer:** With the NBA schedule now past the half-way point, rebounding has proven to be a key element of the Thunder's early-season success. OKC who ranks 6<sup>th</sup> in the NBA in rebounding, has outrebounded their opponent in 28 of 43 games this season. In those games, OKC posts a 19-9 record. Meanwhile, the Thunder is just 5-10 when they fail to rebound their opponent. During a three-game stretch last month (12/23 at PHX – 12/28 at NJ), OKC outrebounded their opponent by 10 or more in each of the three straight contests. It has been four years since the OKC franchise last outrebounded their opponent by 10+ in three consecutive games (12/23/05 – 12/29/05). On the season, the Thunder is 8-1 when outrebounding their opponent by 10 or more.

**Westbrook Dealing:** After recording double-figure assist totals nine times during his rookie season (2008-09), Russell Westbrook tallied his TWELFTH double-figure assist game of this season last Saturday night against Miami (1/16). Westbrook, who currently ranks 8<sup>th</sup> in the NBA with 7.4 assists per game, recorded double-figure assist totals in four straight contests (12/28 – 1/2). The last OKC franchise player to record such a feat was Gary Payton who handed-out 10-plus assists in four consecutive games during the 2001-02 season (1/3/02 – 1/10/02). Oklahoma City is 9-3 this year when Westbrook records 10+ assists.

**Back-2-Back Sets:** OKC enters tonight's match-up versus Cleveland in search of their seventh "split" of the season. Earlier this year, the Thunder captured a "sweep" of a back-to-back match-up by defeating the Nets and Wizards on 12/28 and 12/29. It was the first sweep of a back-to-back by the OKC franchise since March 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> of 2007. During the teams' first eight back-to-backs this season, the Thunder secured a "split" in six of those match-ups to go along with the team's recent "sweep" versus the Nets and Wizards. This year, the Thunder is 4-5 on the first night of a back-to-back and 4-4 on the second night. Last season, the Thunder posted an 8-28 record in their back-to-back match-ups (3-15 in first game, 5-13 in second game).

**Talking Turnovers:** During OKC's recent game at Milwaukee (1/2), Thunder guard Russell Westbrook handed-out 13 assists without committing a single turnover. With ZERO turnovers against the Bucks, he recorded the most assists (13) without a turnover (in franchise history) since April 8, 2001 (Gary Payton; 15 assists, 0 TO's). Additionally, it is the most assists without a turnover in the NBA in nearly a year (Chris Paul 15 assists, zero turnovers; 1/6/09). With his zero-turnover performance in the Thunder's most recent win vs. NY (1/11), Westbrook has failed to commit a single turnover in five games this season (4-1 OKC record). As a team, the Oklahoma City Thunder committed 14 or fewer turnovers in EIGHT consecutive games to close 2009 (12/16 – 12/29). On the year, OKC is 14-8 when committing 15 or fewer turnovers.

**Winning with D:** Despite their 84-86 loss to the Grizzlies on Friday night, the Thunder still ranks 5<sup>th</sup> in the NBA by allowing 95.6 points per game (allowed 103.1 points per game last season). The Thunder has held their opponent to 90 points or fewer in fourteen games this season (12-2 record in such contests). Oklahoma City now leads the NBA in opponent field goal percentage by allowing their opposition to shoot 43.6%. Lastly, defense is quickly becoming the trademark during Thunder victories this season. In the twenty-four Thunder wins (SAC, DET, ORL, LAC, SA, MIA, WAS, UTA, MIL, PHI, GS, MEM, DET, PHX, CHA, NJ, WAS, UTA, CHI, IND, NY, MIA, ATL and MIN), OKC is allowing only 91.8 points per game on 42.3% shooting.

**Select Company:** If Kevin Durant were to maintain his current 29-plus scoring clip throughout the remainder of the season, he would find himself amongst some select NBA company. Only THREE players age 21 or younger (as of season's end) have gone onto average 26-plus points. To the right is a list of all players to accomplish the feat.

**Youth Movement:** The Thunder entered the 2009-10 season as the second youngest team in the NBA with an average age of 25 years and 130 days (as of opening night). They trail only the Memphis Grizzlies who boast an average age of 25 years and 92 days. Additionally, the OKC opening night (10/28) starting lineup (Durant, Green, Krstic, Sefolosa and Westbrook) was the youngest in the league with an average age of 23 years and 179 days. For a matter of comparison, the age of the average NBA roster is 26 years and 329 days and the oldest team in the league entering the 2009-10 season was the San Antonio Spurs with an average age of 29 years and 73 days. There are currently nine players on the Thunder roster age 23 or younger.

**High Five:** By defeating the Utah Jazz at the Ford Center on New Year's eve, the Thunder captured five straight wins (12/23 – 12-31) for the first time since moving to Oklahoma City. The OKC franchise last won five consecutive contests in March of 2005 (3/18/05 – 3/25/05). At the time, the Thunder's five-game win streak was the longest in the NBA's Western Conference. The OKC franchise also improved to a then season-best four games above .500 (18-14) for the first time since the end of the 2004-05 season (52-30). During OKC's five-game undefeated streak, the Thunder shot 48.8% from the floor while outscoring their opposition by a 103.4 to 95.4 margin.

**Player of the Week Honors:** Thunder forward Kevin Durant was awarded Player of the Week Honors by the NBA for games played last week between 12/28 and 1/3. During this seven-day span, KD led the league in scoring (34.3 ppg) as the Thunder Posted a 3-1 mark with victories over New Jersey, Washington and Utah.

**New and Improved:** Through the first three months of the NBA season, Thunder second-year guard Russell Westbrook has shown an improved all-around game. During his first 43 contests, Westbrook is averaging 15.7 points, 7.4 assists and 5.0 rebounds in 35.0 minutes per game. Only a select number of NBA players have maintained such averages throughout the course of an entire season. Below is a list of those second-year players to average 16-plus points, 6-plus assists and 4-plus rebounds during their sophomore NBA seasons.

**Race to 4,000...and Beyond:** Kevin Durant, the NBA's 3<sup>rd</sup> leading scorer (29.2 ppg) became the second youngest NBA player (behind LeBron James) to reach 4,000 career points scored as he knocked-down a 17-foot jump shot midway through the first quarter during the Thunder's recent contest versus the Boston Celtics (12/4). It took Durant all but 173 games played in his young career to reach the 4,000-point plateau. Based on his current scoring clip, Durant is on pace to reach the 5,000 career points list later this season at Minnesota (2/21).

**Technically Speaking:** With seven (individual) technical fouls called through the first forty-three games of the 2009-10 season, the Thunder continue their run of being one of the fewest "T'd-Up" teams in the league. During the 2008-09 season, 11 individual technicals (excludes defensive technicals) were whistled on Thunder players and coaches. This total was the fewest awarded to any NBA team during the season. In addition, the Thunder committed 31 total technical fouls (includes individual and defensive 3-second technicals) which tied for the fewest in the NBA (San Antonio). This total also represents the fewest "T's" committed in the NBA since the 1997-98 season (Golden State; 22).

**Defending When it Matters:** During the Thunder's 83-79 victory over the Los Angeles Clippers (11/11) at STAPLES Center, OKC held the Clippers to just 10 4<sup>th</sup> quarter points on 15.8% shooting (3-19 FG's). The 10 points surrendered in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter is the fewest allowed since the 2006-07 season when the OKC franchise held the New Orleans Hornets to an all-time franchise low six 4<sup>th</sup> quarter points. Through the first 42 games of the season, the Thunder is limiting their opponents to 21.9 points during the final 12 minutes of regulation. In the twenty-four Thunder wins, OKC opponents are shooting just 40.3% (192-476 FG's) in the fourth quarter.

**Ibaka Surges:** At the end of last month, Thunder rookie Serge Ibaka demonstrated improved play to go along with increased minutes on the floor. Through the first 24 games of his rookie season, Ibaka averaged 3.9 points to go along with 3.7 rebounds in just over 9.0 minutes per game. In the four Thunder contests played between 12/18 – 12/23, Ibaka posted scoring averages of 10.5 points (61.8% FG shooting percentage) in addition to 8.5 rebounds in better than 24.0 of action. During this four-game stretch, Ibaka corralled a career-high 14 rebounds 12/22 at LAL. His 14 boards are the most by an OKC rookie since Jeff Green pulled-down 14 rebounds on 11/23/07 vs. NJ.

**Century Mark:** On December 2<sup>nd</sup> versus the Philadelphia 76ers, Thunder guard Russell Westbrook notched his 100<sup>th</sup> career game in memorable fashion. In 34 minutes played vs. Philly, Westbrook recorded a season-high 15 assists, marking the 14<sup>th</sup> time in his career in which he has reached double-figure assist totals. By posting 11 double-doubles (points and assists) through his first 100 career contests, Westbrook becomes one-of-twelve active players to have accomplished the feat. He joins the likes of Jason Kidd, Chris Paul, Allen Iverson and Deron Williams by posting 11-plus double-doubles comprised of points and assists through his first 100 career games played.

**Filling up the Ford:** The Thunder began the 2009-10 season right where they left off... with another sellout. Those that made up the capacity crowd of 18,203 on opening night (10/28) in Oklahoma City were greeted with a new and improved Ford Center. As part of a taxpayer funded initiative passed in March 2008, numerous arena improvements were recently completed. The Ford Center now boasts a state-of-the art scoreboard, new terrace suites and a courtside club to go along with a new and improved Thunder locker room. Last season, fans from near and far flocked to Oklahoma City to witness Thunder basketball. During the Thunder's inaugural season in OKC, the Ford Center recorded 18 sellouts (19,136) including eight consecutive to end the season. In 41 home games, the Thunder's average attendance topped the 18,700 mark (11<sup>th</sup> best in the NBA), accounting for an average capacity of nearly 98.0%. This season, the Thunder has sold-out twelve of their first twenty one home contests. The Thunder is drawing an average crowd of 17,921 through the first two-plus months of the 2009-10 season (98.5% capacity).

**KD in Rarified Air:** With his 28-point performance on 11-of-22 shooting versus the Jazz in Utah, Kevin Durant became just the fourth player in league history, joining LeBron James (twice), Shaquille O'Neal and Michael Jordan, to score at least 400 points during the first 15 games of a season at age 21 or younger. Red-hot scoring streaks are not unfamiliar territory to Durant. Last season prior to his injury at Dallas (2/27), Kevin Durant found himself on a scoring tear seldom witnessed by a second year NBA player. In the 17 games prior to his injury (1/16 vs. DET through 2/24 vs. LAL), Durant posted a scoring average of 32.3 points per game. During this five-week long span, Durant led the NBA in scoring by a 2.4 point per game margin (LeBron James; 29.9 ppg). It had been 35 years since a second-year player last averaged 32+ points across a 17-game span (Bob McAdoo; 34.7 ppg during the 1974 season).

**First Impressions:** With their 102-89 victory over the Sacramento Kings on October 28<sup>th</sup>, the OKC franchise secured their first opening night victory since 2003 when they defeated the Los Angeles Clippers 109-100 in Saitama, Japan. During the Thunder's wire-to-wire win at the Ford Center, Russell Westbrook set a career-high with 13 assists to go along with 14 points and seven rebounds. With his 13 assists, Westbrook single-handily matched the entire assist total for the entire Kings team. The last time an OKC franchise player matched the entire opposing team's assist total occurred in 2006 when Luke Ridnour handed-out 13 assists in a 110-106 defeat vs. the Portland Trail Blazers. The Thunder enters tonight's contest versus the Cavaliers with a record of 24-19 which is the best start for the OKC franchise through the first forty-two games since the 2004-05 season when the team started the season with a record of 30-13.

**Strong back-2-back Showings at the Ford:** With their 127-108 victory over the Wizards on 11/20 and their 108-90 win over the Milwaukee Bucks on 11/27, the OKC franchise won back-to-back home games by 18-plus points for the first time since November of 2004 (Nov. 5<sup>th</sup> – 10<sup>th</sup>). During this two-game home tear, the Thunder averaged 117.5 points on 50.3% shooting (48.6% 3-point shooting). The 127 points scored versus the Wizards on 11/20 was the most recorded in regulation (excluding overtime) by the OKC franchise since February 21<sup>st</sup>, 2001 (127-98 win vs. DEN).

**Perfection from the Stripe:** During OKC's loss to the Sacramento Kings (11/10), Kevin Durant recorded a game-high 37 points in large part due to his efficiency from the charity stripe. Durant set a franchise record by converting 18 made free throws without a miss (also a NBA season-high). Setting all-time franchise records from the free throw line is not unfamiliar to Durant. Last season versus the Los Angeles Clippers (1/23/09), KD converted 24 made free throws (on 26 attempts) en route to a 46-point performance at STAPLES Center. Durant's 24 made free throws set a Thunder franchise record. In addition, Durant set a NBA season-high for most FT's made during the 2008-09 season. In doing so, Durant became one of only four players over the last 20 years to convert 24+ FT's in a single game (MR; LeBron James: 24-of-28 on 3/12/06).

**Lots of Magic at the Ford Center:** During the Thunder's 102-74 victory over the Orlando Magic on November 8<sup>th</sup>, OKC held ORL to 30 second half points on 29.4% field goal shooting (10-34 FG's). The 28-point margin of victory represents the largest Thunder win in Ford Center history. In knocking-off last season's Eastern Conference Champions, the Thunder shot a season-high 57.1% while handing-out a season-best 27 assists. Meanwhile, Orlando shot a season-worst 36.8% while converting a season-low 25 made field goals. Orlando was held to fewer than 75 points for just the third time in the last three-plus seasons. With the victory, the Thunder notched their third win of the year. It was not until December 19<sup>th</sup> of last season (vs. TOR) before the Thunder would claim their third win.

**Country First:** The OKC trio of Kevin Durant, Jeff Green and Russell Westbrook were all invited to participate in the 2009 USA Basketball Men's National Team mini-camp held in Las Vegas this past July. In preparation for the 2010 World Championships and the 2012 Olympic Games in London, USA basketball hosted the three-day event which included an intra-squad Blue vs. White scrimmage on the final day. Thunder Head Athletic Trainer, Joe Sharpe was also invited to participate in the event.

**Harden's Greatest Hits:** In the Thunder match-ups vs. Orlando (11/18) and Washington (11/20), Harden connected on 10-of-13 3-point field goals including seven consecutive makes during this two-game stretch. The seven consecutive makes ties a rookie record for the most consecutive 3-pointers converted by a first-year player since Michael Dickerson made eight straight for the Houston Rockets (5/4/99-5/5/99). His six 3-point makes at Orlando (11/18) tied a rookie franchise record (Rich Frahm; 12/20/03).
